

## CBE Citation Style for Articles from Magazines

The citations of a **References** page should be listed alphabetically and formatted with single-spacing and *hanging indents*. (The first line of each citation is at the left margin. All subsequent lines are indented one-half inch from the left margin.) To create hanging indents, consult the Help feature of your word processing program. The Tab key may also be used. In most word processing programs, it is pre-set to indent the required one-half inch.

### ➤ Magazine article from a hardcopy magazine (print, microfilm, or microfiche)

*Needed information* - Author's last name first initial middle initial (if available). Date of Publication. Title of the article. Title of Magazine:page number(s). (For the ending page number, only give the non-repeated digits. For example, if an article goes from pages 111-119, in the citation it will look like 111-9.)

#### *Example*

Gorman J. 2002 Oct 12. Hydrogen: the next generation. Science News:235-6.

### ➤ Magazine article from an online magazine

*Needed information* - Author's last name first initial middle initial (if available). Date of Publication. Title of the article. Title of Magazine [serial online]:page number(s), if available. Available from: URL. Accessed Year Month Day.

#### *Example with volume number*

Grigg WN. 2003 June 16. McCarthy's "witches." The New American [serial online]. Available from:  
[http://www.thenewamerican.com/tna/2003/06-16-2003/vo19no12\\_witches.htm](http://www.thenewamerican.com/tna/2003/06-16-2003/vo19no12_witches.htm). Accessed 2003 June 25.

### ➤ Full-text magazine article from a database

*Needed information* - Author's last name first initial middle initial (if available). Date of Publication. Title of the article. Title of Magazine [serial online]:page number(s), if available. Available from: Database Name(Article's Accession Number, if available). Accessed Year Month Day.

#### *Example of full-text article with original pages numbers present*

Jonietz E. 2003 June. Cloning, stem cells, and medicine's future. Technology Review [serial online]:70-1. Available from: EBSCOhost/Academic Search Premier(9769388). Accessed 2003 June 25.

### ➤ Magazine article with no author

Place [Anonymous] in the author position.

#### *Example*

[Anonymous]. 2003 Aug 9. Chasing the dream. Economist:62.

### ➤ Magazine article with multiple authors (Use these formats to replace single author names in the above examples.)

*Two authors* - Rogers MA, King C.

*Three authors* - Edwards C, Nadar LS, Brown P.

*More than three authors* - List them all. Follow the style for *Three authors* above.
