

## CBE Citation Style for Web Pages

The citations of a **References** page should be listed alphabetically and formatted with single-spacing and *hanging indents*. (The first line of each citation is at the left margin. All subsequent lines are indented one-half inch from the left margin.) To create hanging indents, consult the Help feature of your word processing program. The Tab key may also be used. In most word processing programs, it is pre-set to indent the required one-half inch.

### ➤ **Web pages**

*Needed information* - Author's last name first initial middle initial (if available). Date of Publication or Last Revision. Title of the Web page. Title of the complete work, if relevant. Available from: URL. Accessed Year Month Day.

#### *Example with and editor*

*Examples with corporations/organizations as authors - Put the abbreviated name in brackets, and then spell out the corporation/organization.*

[EPA] Environmental Protection Agency. 2002 July 14. Hot tips for a cool summer. Available from: <http://www.epa.gov/epahome/hi-summer.htm>. Accessed 2003 Aug 25.

### ➤ **Web page with no author or editor**

Place [Anonymous] in the author position.

#### *Example*

[Anonymous]. 2002 July. Endangered species: salmon & bull trout - the issue. Municipal Research and Services Center of Washington Web site. Available from: <http://www.mrsc.org/Subjects/Environment/esa/esa-intr.aspx>. Accessed 2003 Aug 25.

### ➤ **Web pages with multiple authors** (Use these formats to replace single author names in the above examples.)

*Two authors* - Rogers MA, King C.

*Three authors* - Edwards C, Nadar LS, Brown P.

*More than three authors* - List them all. Follow the style for *Three authors* above.
